We will also increase awareness of the critical importance of early life experiences in achieving lifelong health and well-being.

Pritzker Prenatal-to-Age-Three Planning Grant (\$100,000)


Establish a coalition of diverse stakeholders; develop an action plan and implementation strategy.

Pritzker Goals 1 & 2

For those at or below 200% FPL, the number of children prenatal-toage 3 (PN3) accessing high-quality services will:

- 1. Increase by 25% by 2023
- 2. Increase by 50% by 2025

The total MD estimate population of PN3 children ≤ 200% FPL = 64,250

- Serving 25% by 2023 = 16,063
- Serving 50% by 2025 = 32,125

Area 1: Good Health/Healthy Beginnings

Increase the number of expectant families and those with infants and toddlers *receiving high-quality health and health-related services*.

- 2 year olds receiving **WIC** due to passage of Wise Investment in our Children Act.
- Families served in HealthySteps (Medical Home).
- Children 9-36 months receiving fluoride varnish.
- Expectant families served in **Centering Pregnancy** Programs.
- Families with young children served in **Centering Parenting** Programs.
- Spanish-Speaking mothers with infants and toddlers participating in Group Well Child Visits (Centering Parenting).
- African American/Black women accessing **doula services**.

Area 1: Good Health/Healthy Beginnings (con't)

Increase the number of families with infants and toddlers with developmental delays/disabilities receiving services from the *Maryland Infant and Toddlers Program*.

Increase the number of families with infants and toddlers with special needs receiving *high-quality care coordination* & *family peer navigation services*.

- Families with young children receiving care coordination/peer navigation from **Parent Partners and** Maryland Coalition of Family's **Peer Navigation Program**
- Expectant families and those with young children served through the Carroll County Youth Services Bureau as part of E-SMART Early Childhood Mental Health Project and Southern Maryland BRIDGE Project.
- Families participating in Family Connects
- Families with high-risk pregnancies receiving high-quality comprehensive care coordination through the **Thrive by Three** fund.

Area 1: Good Health/Healthy Beginnings (con't)

Increase the number of expectant families and those with infants and toddlers receiving *high-quality mental and behavioral health services*.

- Families with infants and toddlers receiving **infant and early childhood mental health consultation services** (IECMHC).
- Women delivering at hospitals fully implementing the **AIM Patient Safety Bundle** related to opioids.
- Pregnant and postpartum women with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) receiving **enhanced clinical services and care coordination**.

Area 2: Strong Families/Family Support

Increase the number of families with infants and toddlers receiving services at *place-based program sites that offer two-generation programs and services*.

- Families with infants and toddlers utilizing services at Judy Centers.
- Families with infants and toddlers utilizing services from **Family Support Centers**.
- Families with infants and toddlers in Baltimore City participating in the **Couples Advancing Together** two-generation model.

Area 2: Strong Families/Family Support (con't)

Increase the number of expectant families and those with young children receiving *evidence-based home-based services*.

- Expectant families and those with young children served in Home Visiting programs as a result of Families First Prevention and Services Act.
- Expectant families and those with young children served in the Attachment and Biobehavioral Catchup (ABC) model.

Increase the number of expectant families and those with young children participating in *parenting education and support programs*.

• Expectant families and those with young children served in programs that support healthy family and child development (e.g., Circle of Security).

Area 3: Positive Early Learning Experiences/ Early Care and Learning

Increase the number infants and toddlers participating in *high-quality child care settings.*

- More infants and toddlers served in high-quality **child care slots** in centerbased and home-based settings. (High quality = EXCELS 3+).
- Expanded number of Family Child Care Homes in Montgomery County.
- More families with infants and toddlers receiving LENA Grow intervention.

Increase the number of infants and toddlers participating in Early Head Start (EHS).

Increase the number of teen parents with infants and toddlers receiving **school-based child care**.

Area 4: Systems & Infrastructure Development

- Develop **sustainable governance** of the PN-3 initiative.
- Establish a sustainable PN-3 infrastructure in Maryland.
- Develop widely shared vision and promote public awareness; build public will to support enhanced funding for PN-3 services.
- Improve **data systems** in the state of Maryland to better understand the PN-3 population and program outcomes.
- Increase parent engagement and develop a cadre of parent leaders.

Area 4: Systems & Infrastructure Development (cont'd)

- Enhance **workforce and professional development** across Maryland for educators and providers who work with children prenatal up to age three.
- Embed principles and practices for **diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI)** across Maryland.
- Embed practicing strengths-based and trauma-informed approaches across Maryland.
- Coordinate advocacy efforts for the PN-3 population across organizations and sectors.
- Promote universal screening of pregnant women through increased utilization of the Prenatal Risk Assessment (PRA) across Maryland.
