What is Maryland EXCELS?


Maryland EXCELS is the state's Quality Rating and Improvement System for licensed child care and early education programs. It provides programs with training, resources, and one-on-one assistance so that they can provide the best quality education and care. Participating programs can achieve a Maryland EXCELS Quality Rating 1-5. These ratings are available to families, allowing them to make informed choices concerning the care of their children.

How does Maryland EXCELS and quality child care prepare my child for school and life?

Choosing a Maryland EXCELS program means your family will receive services that go above and beyond the state's basic requirements for child care. Maryland EXCELS programs are committed to quality and they receive support for their continued improvement.

Research shows that high-quality child care leads to student achievement in school, increases the likelihood that students will graduate high school and attend college, and increases salaries and health outcomes in adulthood.

How can I know if my child care program participates in Maryland EXCELS? Search for your program at https://findaprogram.marylandexcels.org/ and look for the Maryland EXCELS Quality Rating Badge next to your program's name. Click on the Program Details button to view rating details. Participating programs will also note that they are eligible to accept Child Care Scholarship vouchers.



How can I know if my child care program has a history of health or safety violations?

Go to <u>www.checkccmd.org</u> and search for your child care program. Click on your program name to view a summary page that displays the current status. Scroll down to view Inspection History Information. Click on an inspection report to view more details.

How can I submit a complaint through the hotline about suspected fraud or other concerns about the Child Care Scholarship Program that do not seem right?

Go to the <u>Reporting Possible Child Care Scholarship Fraud</u> page and use the <u>Suspected Fraud Form</u> to report your suspicions online or call the Maryland Department of Human Services 1-800-332-6347 and follow the prompts to select the Suspected Fraud option.

How do I report suspected child abuse or neglect in a licensed child care program?

If you believe a particular child care program is in violation of State child care licensing laws or regulations, you may file an official complaint against that program. To file a complaint, contact the Regional Licensing Office covering the county where the program is located. Complaints may be filed in person, by telephone, or in writing by e-mail, fax, or letter. Anonymous complaints are accepted, so complainants do not need to identify themselves. The Regional Licensing Office investigates each complaint. Upon completion of the investigation, a report of findings is created. This report is available upon request if the investigation confirms that the violation occurred, or if it cannot be determined that the violation occurred.
