Join our Virtual ELA Implementation Academy

The Virtual ELA Implementation Academy provides online professional learning and coaching for high-quality local early learning teams. Teams should consist of 3-8 individuals including teachers, related service providers (e.g. speech and language pathologists), instructional coaches, site-based administrators and general education and special education district administrators. We will train your team to use the John Hopkins University Dynamic Impact approach to develop and execute an implementation plan that increases the fidelity of ELA implementation at your site and improves outcomes for children and families.

Teams from each site will meet virtually for a Kickoff Institute, two Mid-Point Workshops, and an Academy Closing Workshop to understand how to use the ELA Implementation Fidelity Tool to collect and analyze implementation data and develop an action plan to improve ELA implementation across their system.

- Meet once per month with your internal team to plan for ELA implementation using your action plan (at least 30 minutes)
